84% of builders report labor shortages versus 13% in 2011. Shortages drive up builder costs, lengthen building cycle times, and hamper construction activity.

Our Crumbling Infrastructure

Bridges

- 9.1% of bridges are structurally deficient
- \$123 billion needed for backlog of bridge rehabs

≻ <u>Rail</u>

- 750,000 Northeast Corridor passenger trips daily
- 40% estimated 30 year growth of rail freight shipments

≻ <u>Roads</u>

- \$160 billion annual cost of fuel and time lost to congestion
- \$713 billion backlog of highway capital needs ex. Bridges

Drinking Water

- 240,000 estimated water main breaks per year
- 6 billion galloons of treated water lost from leaking pipes
